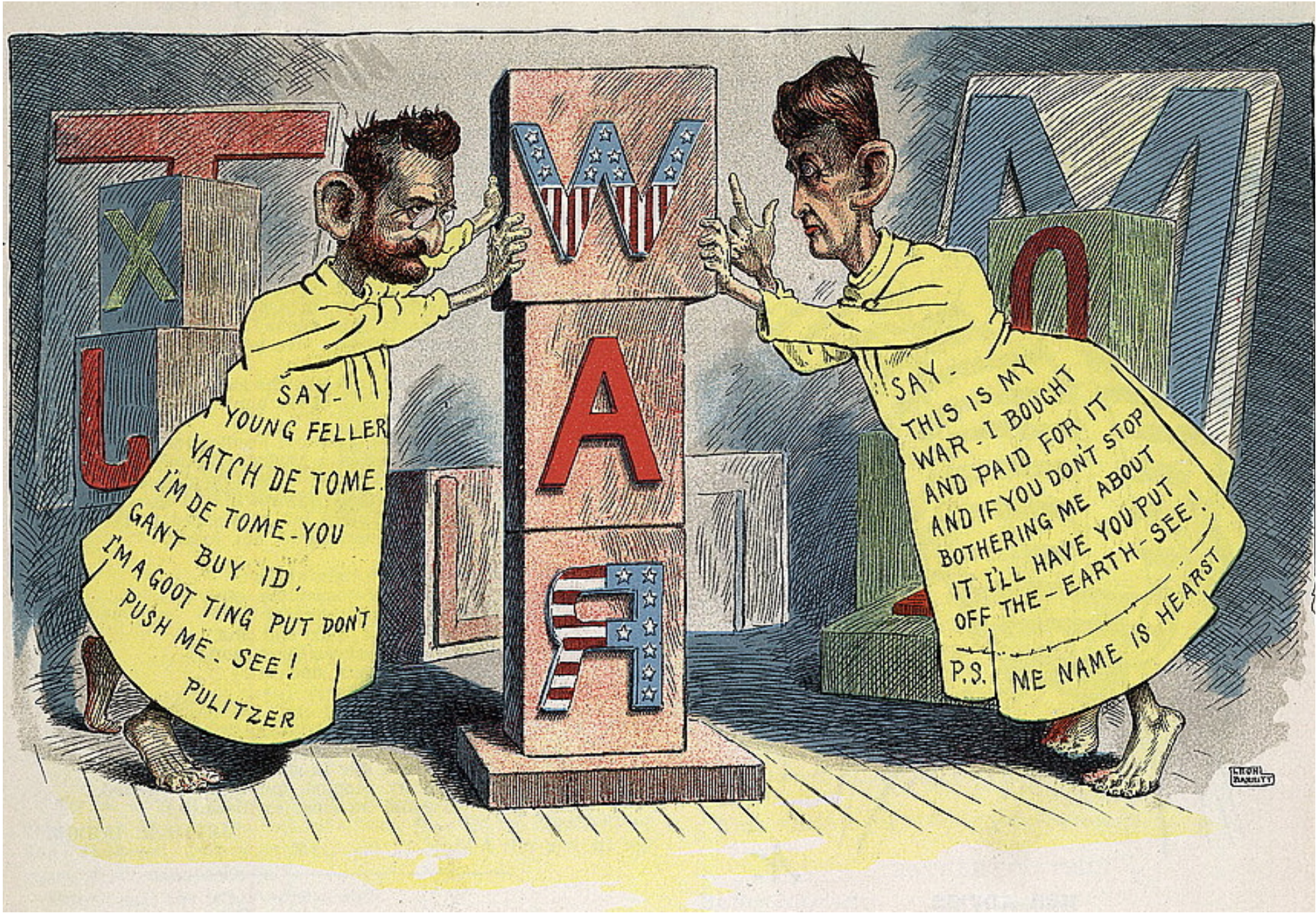

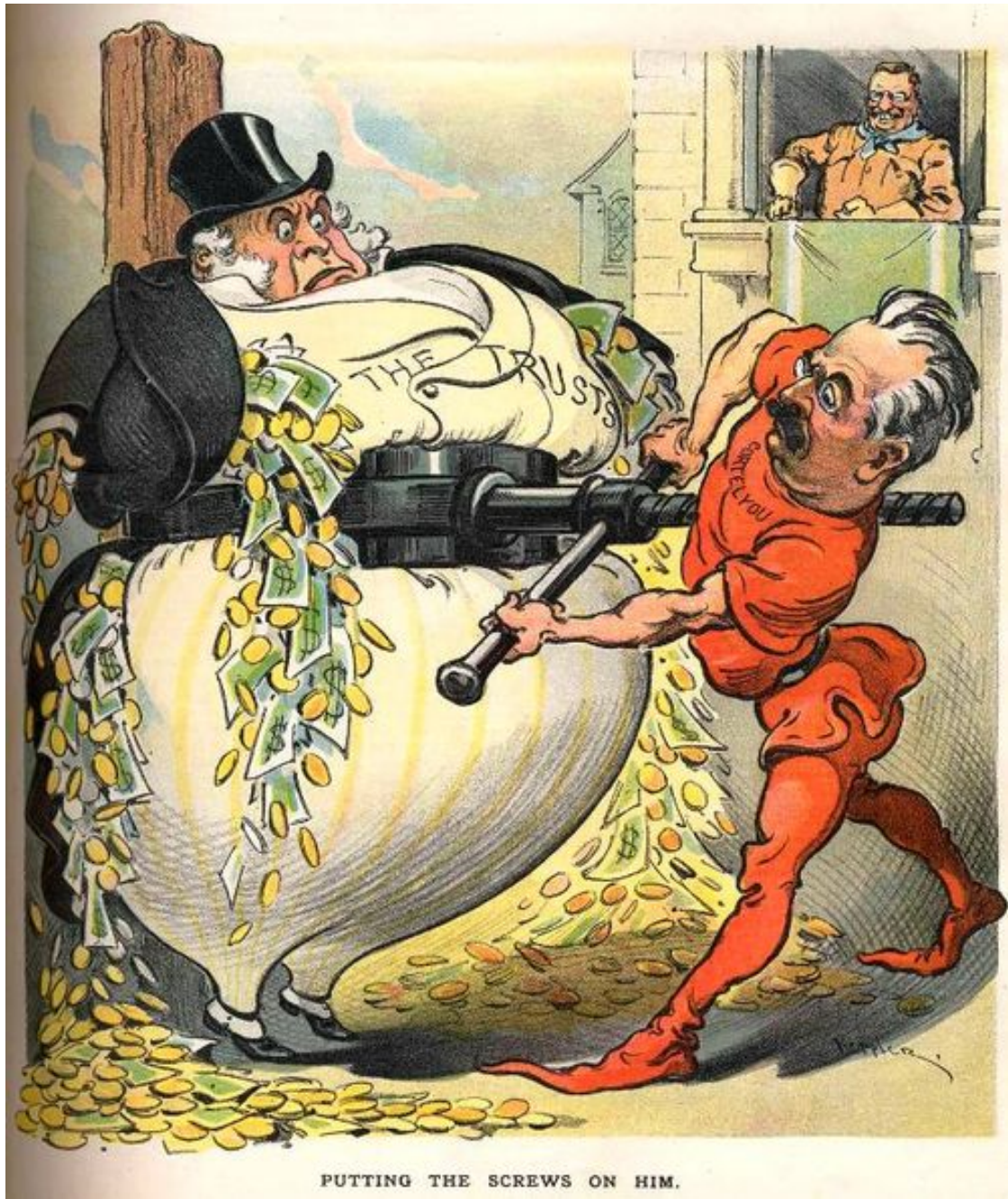

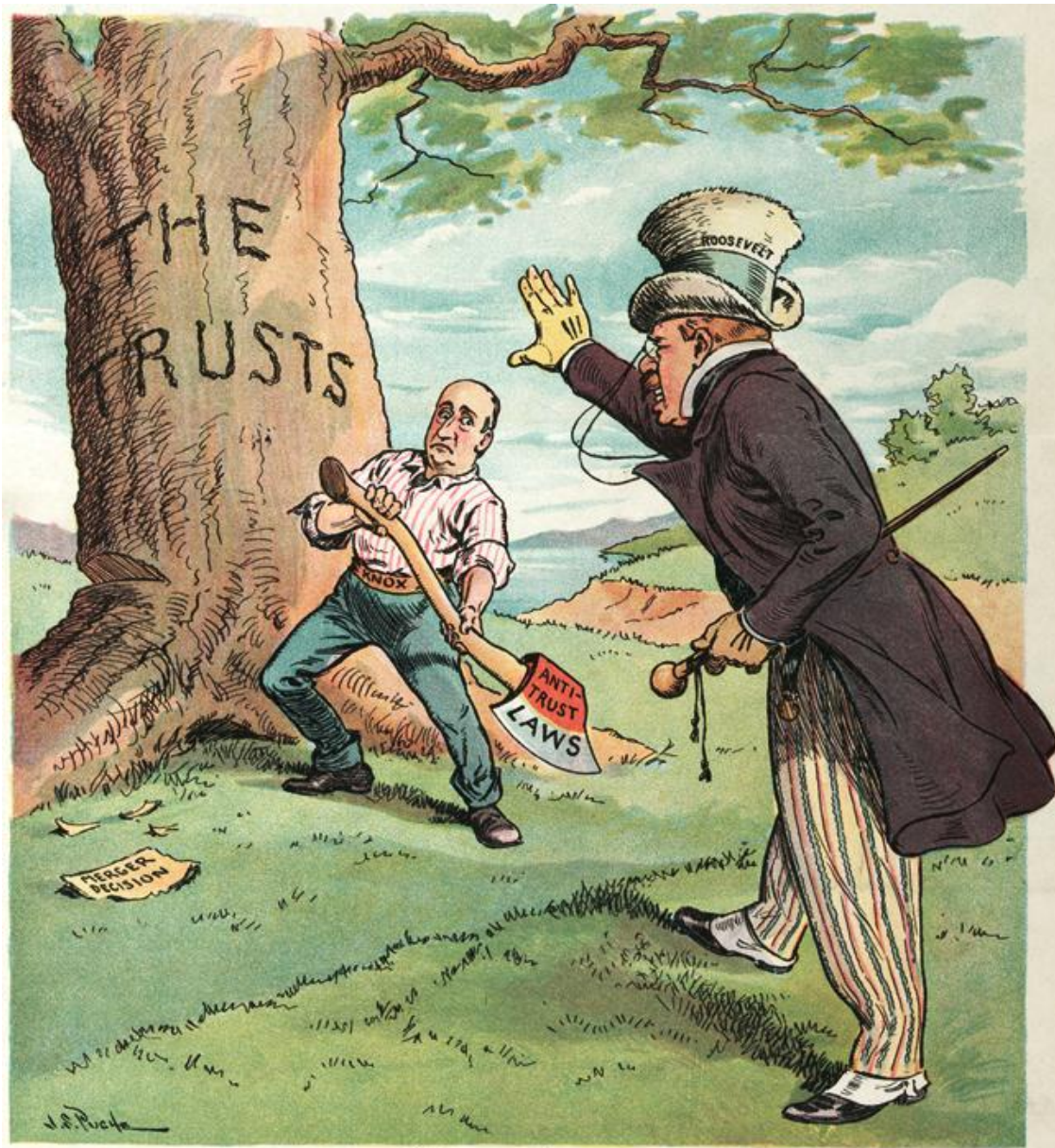

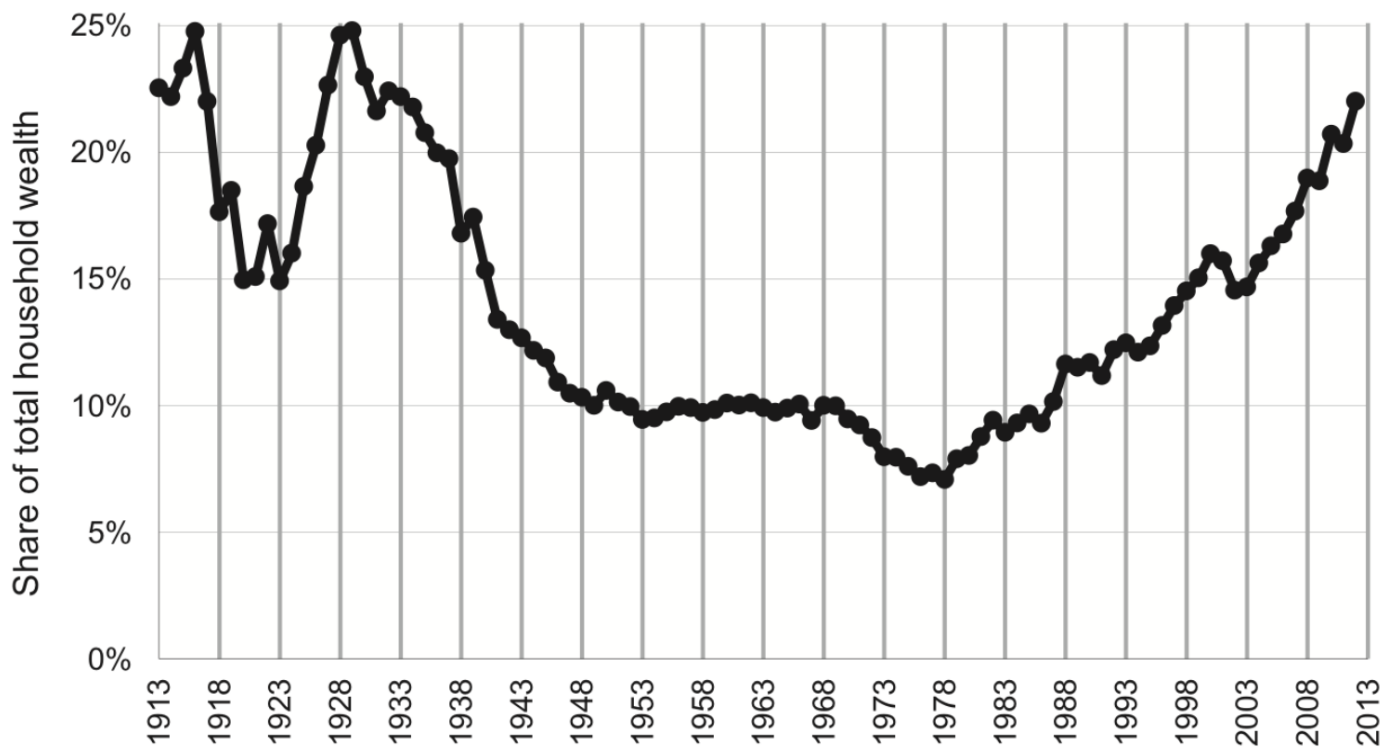
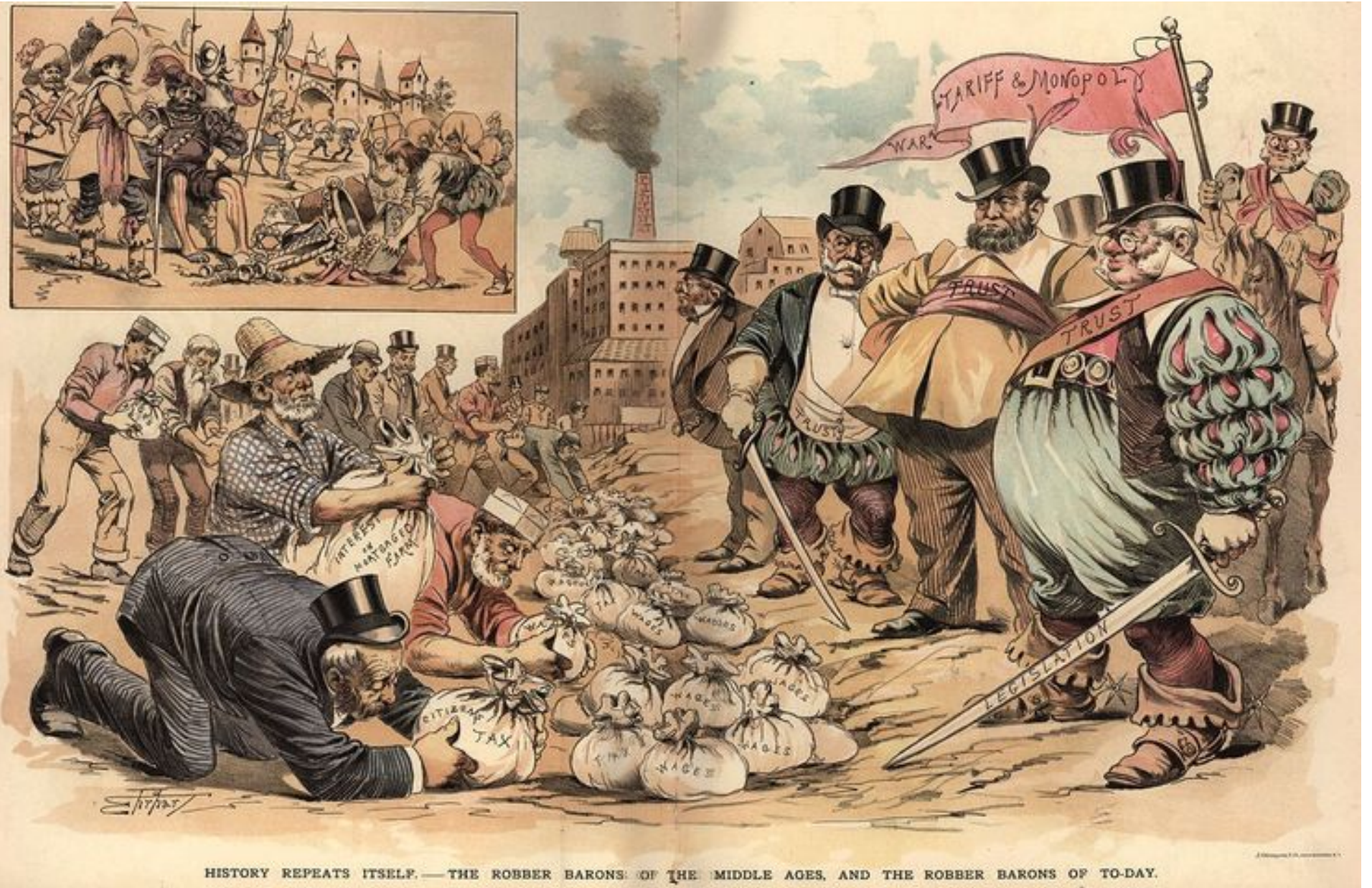

Top 0.1% Wealth Share in the United States, 1913–2012

The figure plots the share of total household wealth owned by the richest .1% of families in the United States from 1913 to 2012. The unit is the family (either a single person aged 20 or above or a married couple, in both cases with children dependents if any). The top .1% is defined relative to the total number of families in the population. In 2012, the top .1% included about 160,000 families with a net worth above \$20.6 million.
